AN ABBREVIATED SUMMARY OF M. ADLER'S, *How to Read a Book*

- Follow fingers across page as fast as possible
- Do Inspectional Reading: Read to Comprehend . . .
  - Title;
  - Table of Contents (Relating Headings to one another);
  - Indexes;
  - 2-3 paragraphs in different sections (esp. intro. & conc.);
  - Book's category, scope, structure, & theme.
  - Also, make structural & conceptual notes as time permits
- Use back end-papers to make personal index of authors thoughts in order of appearance.
- Use front end-papers to outline conceptual structure.

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**IF YOU WANT TO READ WELL . . .**

**BE A DEMANDING READER**

- A demanding reader **desires** to read.
  - She **wants** to read her books, and
  - She **wants** to *understand* her books.
  
- He **interrogates** *all* his books with *general questions*.
  - What is it about as a whole?
  - What is being said in detail?
  - How is it being said?
  - What is it's significance?

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
